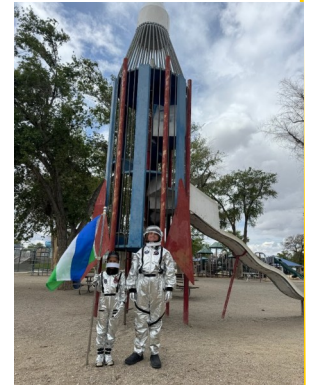

The Molossian Air and Space Agency is proud to announce an intensive training and testing process for our brave Molossonauts. Before these intrepid voyagers can launch forth into the heavens, they first need to be trained for any and all eventualities. God bless you, Long Live Molossia!

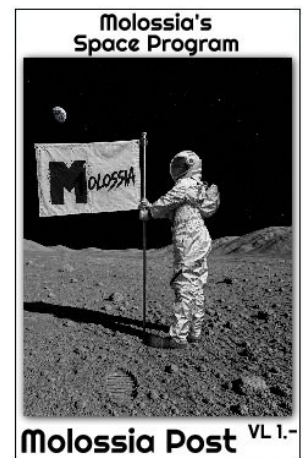

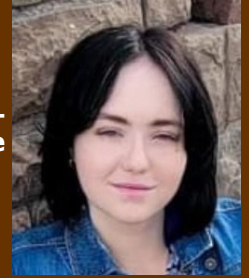
June Calendar
